






A Word From Our Program Coordinator



Dear Oral Health Champions:

Your Local Oral Health Program, Smile Humboldt, is celebrating a year of wins! We are excited to share some wonderful successes from the 2024–2025 school year, none of which could have happened without the support of Humboldt County's families, schools and community partners. Here are the highlights:

- Smile Humboldt screened 1,175 students across Humboldt County 600 more students than the prior school year.
- We helped connect over 300 students to dental care on the school-based dental vans operated by Open Door and Redwoods Rural Health Center.
- More than 70% of eligible students turned in their Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment (KOHA) form, which was an 8% increase from the prior year.
- Oral health supplies were provided to 3,130 students through our partnership with Redwood Community Action Agency's TOOTH Program, which provided oral health lessons in 153 classes across 31 schools, grades K-8th.
- Our Brush in a Box program supported local daycares by providing dental supplies for on-site toothbrushing for 93 children under the age of five.

I had the great honor of representing Humboldt County Public Health at the Center for Oral Health's Symposium, *Oral Health & Quality of Life Among Older Adults,* in Sacramento last month. I met numerous dental professionals and advocates who had no knowledge of Humboldt County's beautiful landscape, vibrant community or our oral health access challenges. It was a privilege to shine a light on the oral health disparities that exist for California's rural residents through a presentation entitled, *Behind the Redwood Curtain: Oral Health on California's North Coast.*

It was encouraging to be in a room full of individuals committed improving oral health in California. Several dental professionals expressed their interest in visiting our county to see if it could be a place they could call home and bring much needed care to the community. Let's hope they do!

KINDERGARTEN ORAL HEALTH ASSESSMENT (KOHA)

What is a KOHA?

The Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment (KOHA) is a state requirement passed into law in 2006 requiring children enrolled in public school for their first year (transitional kindergarten [TK], kindergarten or first grade) to have an oral health screening completed by a licensed dental professional.

Why is the KOHA Important?

The Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment is a state requirement that helps schools and families know whether children are starting school with healthy teeth. Having healthy teeth is crucial to one's overall health, wellbeing, and to be open to learning—children with cavities can have trouble eating, sleeping and focusing in class. The KOHA helps identify any dental needs early, so families can get connected with care and kids can succeed both in and out of the classroom.

How Do Families Complete the KOHA?

- First, get a KOHA form- of which is located <u>here.</u>
- Schedule the child's dental checkup before May 2026. The <u>Smile Humboldt Family</u> Program can help find a dental home for families that don't have one.
- Bring the KOHA form to the visit and request your dentist or licensed dental professional fill it out.
- Lastly, give the completed form to child's school.

Let's Keep the KOHA Winning Streak Going!

Humboldt County schools set a record for the number of KOHAs collected in the 2024-25 school year! Supporting the KOHA requirement is a simple way that schools can promote school readiness by identifying students suffering from untreated dental disease and helping connect families to a dental home.

Toothy Tips for the Season

Sweet Tips and Tricks for Celebrating the Holidays Cavity Free

Halloween is the official kick-off to the holiday season, which is a time of the year that many of us celebrate with treats and sweets. But enjoying the holidays doesn't have to mean bad news for your teeth. Here are some simple tips and tricks to keep those smiles healthy all season long:

1. Choose Candy Wisely

Not all treats are equal when it comes to teeth. Candies like gummies, caramels, hard candies and sour candies are particularly tough on teeth. Chocolate is a better option since it melts in your mouth. Dark chocolate is even better because it contains less sugar than milk chocolate.

2. Drink Water with and After Your Treats

Encourage kids (and adults!) to sip water after enjoying sweets. Water helps wash any leftover sugar off your teeth from your holiday snacking and most importantly, water helps stop the acid attack cycle in your mouth that can cause cavities.

4. Set a Candy Game Plan

The holiday season is not just about sweets! You can focus on gifting non-candy items (like stickers, or small toys) in all your festive gatherings.
